Arrival date: Saturday 31 October or Sunday 1 November.

Departure: Saturday 7 afternoon or evening of Sunday 8 November.

Travel information

The nearest airport is Barcelona international airport (El Prat de Llobregat Aeropuerto or Aeroport de Barcelona), 13 km South West of the city centre.

A taxi would cost around €25.00 to Barcelona centre and will take you about 20 minutes travel time. You can also catch the RENFE train, fare €4,10, it takes about 25 minutes, or the Aerobus express bus service which costs €5.90 and takes about 25 minutes.

There are 2 smaller airports at about 100 km from Barcelona (popular with budget airlines like Ryanair):

- Girona airport. The Barcelona Bus will take you to Barcelona centre in about 1hr 10 minutes and cost €15.00 - €25.00 for a single ticket. One of the advantages of flying to Girona is that you could catch the train to see the Dalí Museum in Figueres, since it is close by, and then catch the train to Barcelona centre. Girona centre also offers an interesting half day visit.

- Reus airport. There is a public bus that leaves from Reus airport to Barcelona. It leaves from directly outside the door of arrivals at Reus airport. It's operated by the company Hispano Igualadina, and you can buy tickets in the ticket office in the arrivals terminal.

The journey time is one and a half hours, and it costs €12.50 for a single ticket and €22.00 for a return. The bus travels to Barcelona Sants bus station. The time table is adapted to coincide with flight arrivals.

The course is designed to help teachers realize the potential of innovative methodology using technologies in everyday classroom practice by investigating the added value of a collaborative, project-based approach. This course is intended for anyone with a desire to increase their proficiency in using a practical methodology which brings technology into the classroom. The course content is not limited to teachers of a specific subject. On the contrary it is open to teachers of all subjects and levels. The aim of the course is to enable participants to use activities using ICT through a methodology based on collaborative work. Web 2.0, Social Networking, Blogging and Webquests will support and enhance language interdisciplinary inquiry and the use and creation of digital teaching methodology besides the introduction to the appropriate methodology a Strategic Partnership under Erasmus+ must be implemented.

Preparation

Before the training, selected participants will be invited to present their respective views on the training and select priority issues.

Objectives

- Provide teachers with practical ideas for how they can incorporate technology into their existing lessons.
- Providing general information about ICT within various classes
- Defining ICT usage in education with its benefits, provide teachers with practical ideas for how they can incorporate technology into their existing lessons.
- Familiarize teachers with current Internet trends
- Giving a space for exchange of experiences and good practices among people coming from different countries who work in the same field
- Higher motivation to remain on task by working in small groups using Web 2.0;
- Developing actively and constructively students' involvement in the work at class;
- Encouraging students to take the ownership of their own learning;
- Improving teamwork by stimulating the necessary skills to start up a strategic partnership (KA2) under Erasmus+;
- Exchanging experiences in cooperative and collaborative learning process as long as in creativity and innovation;
- Sharing of best practice in teaching and learning, using ICT, enabling teachers to become confident and competent enough to create a collaborative, interactive classroom experience for their students through the use of the ICT.

Methodology

Coursework will contain a mix of theoretical and practical knowledge. Participants will be given the theoretical information that they need to effectively create and implement their own learning solutions. Using this theoretical knowledge, they will then complete several practical tasks designed to demonstrate the importance of collaborative work.

Follow up

Cervantes Training will be available for consults via email to clarify doubts, offer advice after the course and will tutor the practical assignment tasks to do after the course.

Enrolment Fees: 490 Euros*- Course Price includes: Registration Fees and tuition for the course (7 days- 30 hour-training course- including socio-cultural activities), Course Material, Certificate of Attendance, dossier with information material about Alcalá de Henares, City Guided Tour and entrance to The Cervantes Birthplace Museum.
